1954	Unitarian Fellowship of Roanoke (first Patrick Henry Hotel, then YWCA)
1961	Roanoke Valley Unitarian Church of Cave Spring (McVitty Church pictured above)
1962	First Minister, Greta Cosby, installed
1985	Moved into our current building (acquired from the Mormons)
1980s	New name: the Unitarian Universalist Church of Roanoke
1987	Rev. Kirk Ballin installed (served until 1999)
2024	Welcomed Rev. Jen Raffensperger!

- Increased number of visitors and new members.
- Greater demand for rental space from community organizations.
- More than 40 years since the last capital campaign.
- Fifty members volunteered to assist with the campaign.
- More than 100 members and friends voiced support during focus group meetings.
- Unanimous vote of support from the Board and the Capital Campaign steering committee.
- Dynamic new minister who fully supports campaign efforts.

What Might Be Possible?

N addition to urgent and fundamental upgrades, the following shows what might be possible if we raise sufficient funds during our Capital Campaign.

Accessibility & ——— Welcoming Proposals

- ADA-compliant restrooms
- Elevator
- Additional accessible parking spaces
- Automatic door openers
- Hearing assistance A/V system
- Foyer entrance from parking lot

Safety & —— Security Proposals

- Integrated fire, burglar, and carbon monoxide alarm system
- New electrical wiring
- Asbestos abatement
- Exterior security lighting
- Camera monitoring system
- Emergency generator
- Card reader access system

Energy Efficiency Proposals

- High-efficiency, zoned heat pumps and AC units
- Energy-efficient doors, windows
- New roof; perhaps solar panels
- · Attic fans and insulation
- LED lighting with motion sensors


Beautification& Function Proposals


- · Better lighting and carpeting
- Fresh paint with vibrant colors
- Remodeling for more rooms, storage, and choir risers
- Improved acoustics
- Upgraded playground
- Motorized window coverings

Growth Accommodation Proposals

- Expand and reorient the entrance foyer
- Repurpose stage area and reconfigure sanctuary to provide up to 30% more seating
- Develop UUCR-owned lot across the street for additional parking











A s the Capital Campaign continues and pledged amounts are confirmed and gathered over the course of 2025-2028, UUCR will begin work according to available funds and the following likely priorities:

MUST DO

- Architectural and engineering plans
- Rental space, as needed during remodeling
- Asbestos testing and abatement
- Plumbing upgrades (e.g., toilet renovations with accessibility improvements)
- Electrical upgrades to meet current codes (e.g., fire alarm; LED lighting; automatic door openers)
- Mechanical upgrades (e.g., new energy efficient and zoned HVAC)

SHOULD DO

- Elevator (to make the second floor accessible)
- New interior finishes (e.g., painting; flooring; acoustical treatment)
- New energy efficient windows and reinstallation of existing stained glass
- New modular choir risers
- New metal roof

WANT TO DO

- Larger lobby; covered walkway signage visible from parking lot
- Sanctuary expansion
- New A/V system
- Solar panels on roof



How Much Should You Give?

At UUCR, we believe in equal commitment to giving, not equal giving. Making a pledge is part of the covenant we share as a faith community.

Annual Generosity Campaign

Our core operating budget – payroll, supplies, facility upkeep, programs – is determined by the pledges we receive during our annual Generosity Campaign. Please do not reduce the amount you would usually gift us for our core operations in order to contribute to the Capital Campaign.

2025-2028 Capital Campaign

A capital campaign seeks significan sums over and above annual giving. It is held only when there is a need for substantial investment in our permanent properties. A capital campaign pledge may be divided into payments over a longer period of time.

Take a look at the following "Giving Table", which shows a range of capital campaign pledge amounts and the different options for delivering your pledge over the course of three years.
