The Pledge to End Racism is a personal commitment to work on ourselves and with others throughout our community to address racism in all its forms. It offers individuals, faith communities, and other groups a place to build a common understanding, language, and commitment for a just, more equitable society. The Roanoke Pledge to End Racism Steering Committee (composed of leaders from Williams Memorial Baptist Church and Unitarian Universalist Church of Roanoke) invite you to participate in the Living the Pledge to End Racism Workshop.

What is the Living the Pledge Workshop?

Its goals for participants include

- learning how to confront racism and bias in everyday encounters;
- · recognizing and challenging systemic racism;
- taking on a personal leadership role in ending racism in their community.

Who is this workshop for?

This workshop is for people who want to deepen their understanding of and commitment to anti-racism, regardless of their prior experience, if any, with anti-racism work. It is suitable for adults and high-school aged teens.

Participants prepare for each session by reading articles and watching short videos that are sent in advance via e-mail.

The Pledge to End Racism (adapted from the Birmingham Pledge)

I believe that every person has worth as an individual.

I believe that every person is entitled to dignity and respect, regardless of race or color.

I believe that every thought and every act of racial prejudice is harmful; if it is my thought or act, then it is harmful to me as well as to others.

Therefore, from this day forward, I will strive daily to eliminate racial prejudice from my thoughts and actions.

I will discourage racial prejudice by others at every opportunity.

I will treat all people with dignity and respect.

I will commit to working with others to transform my church and community into a place that treats people of all races, ethnicities, and cultures with justice, equity, and compassion, and I will strive daily to honor this pledge, knowing that the world will be a better place because of my effort.
